Middle school girls break two school records, finish 2nd, boys tie for 3rd in Eastwood Relays; teams win meets against Elmwood, Genoa

LUCKEY — Eastwood Middle School's girls track and field team finished second and the boys tied for third Thursday in the Eastwood Relays. Earlier in the week, the girls and boys both defeated Genoa and Elmwood in Northern Buckeye Conference dual meets.

THURSDAY

Girls second in Eastwood Relays and break 2 school records

Eastwood won four events and scored 90 points to finish one point behind champion Fremont in the seven-team meet.

The Eagles' winners were:

• 4x100 relay, team of Macy Shoemaker, Mallie Bradley, Lauren Schuerman and Josie Appelhans, 54.01. This is a new school record.

• 800 sprint medley relay (100-100-200-400), team of Stella Chlebowski, Bradley, Schuerman and Appelhans, 2:00.16 and is also a new school record.

• Pole vault relay, team of Karissa Nelson, Chlebowski and Addison Goodlet, combined height of 19-0. Nelson tied for first individually at 7-6, while Chlebowski cleared 6-0 and Goodlet cleared 5-6.

• High jump relay, team of Camille Foos, Shoemaker and Lola Coan, 12-6¼. Foos cleared 4-8, while Shoemaker cleared 4-2¼ and Coan cleared 3-8.

Boys tie for third in Eastwood Relays

Eastwood won two events and scored 72 points to tie Fremont for third. Bellevue won with 90, while Oak Harbor was second with 74. The Eagles' winners were:

• 4x110 shuttle hurdles relay, team of Cam Shumaker, Brayden Luidhardt, Zander Arnold and Nate Grigson, 1:13.17.

• Long jump relay, team of Grigson, Shumaker and Jackson Vetter, 48-8. Grigson was the top individual with a distance of $18-2\frac{3}{4}$, while Shumaker jumped $16-6\frac{3}{4}$ and Vetter jumped $14-1\frac{1}{2}$.

In the pole vault, Shumaker was one of three athletes to clear 9-6.

WEDNESDAY

Girls beat Elmwood, Applehans breaks the 200 m record

The girls won 15 events in their 101-27 victory over Elmwood.

Eastwood's Nelson, Chlebowski and Foos each won twice.

Nelson won the 100 hurdles in 19.30, and tied for first with Chlebowski in the pole vault as both cleared 6-6. Chlebowski also won the 200 hurdles in 33.47.

Foos won the 400 in 1:06.76, and cleared 4-2 to win the high jump.

The Eagles' other individual winners were: Bradley, 100, 14.05; Raegan Russell, 1,600, 6:17.43; Keira Dawson, 800, 2:43.57; Appelhans, 200, 26.92 (This time breaks her previous school record); Schuerman, long jump, 13-8¹/₂; and Harper Rollins-Morlock, shot put, 32-1.
