

Middle schools boys, girls sweep Genoa

GENOA — Eastwood Middle School's boys and girls track and field teams both defeated Genoa Wednesday.

The boys were 85-38 winners with 10 first-place finishes, including all five field events. The girls won seven events in their 70-53 victory.

Jesse Poiry won both hurdles races for Eastwood in the boys meet. He won the 110 race in 17.2 and the 200 race in 28.0.

The Eagles' other individual winners were: Jack Moorman, 800, 2:30; Braden Dix, discus, 101-4; Dayquan Oliver, high jump, 5-0; Kevin Lewis, long jump, 17-7½; Hunter Lauer, shot put, 35-10½; and Hayden Hoelter, pole vault, 8-6.

Eastwood won two relays. The 4x200 team of Parker Bengry, Kellan Miesmer, Wyatt Ashby and Zachary Mullholand won in 1:51.5; and the 4x400 team of Poiry, Eric Sander, Ashby and Moorman won in 4:23.

In the girls meet, six different individuals and one relay team won for Eastwood.

The individual winners were: Mallory Sandberg, 100 hurdles, 18.8; Leah Emch, 6:01; Lilly Mullholand, 400, 1:07.4; Emerson Sheets, 800, 2:52.6; Addison Hartman, high jump, 4-4; and Kyrie Henline, pole vault, 6-6.

The 4x400 team of Makenna Nelson, Sheets, Jordan Jensen and Emch won in 4:55.

The Eagles host the Eastwood Relays Friday night. The girls pole vault starts at 4:15, followed by the rest of the field events at 4:30 and the running events at 5:45.

Joining Eastwood in the meet are: Bellevue, Fostoria, Genoa, Oak Harbor, Ottawa Hills and Rossford.
