

Downs, Henline reach Eagles' Top 10 as girls, boys sweep tri-meet

ELMORE — Emma Downs ran the third-fastest 100 time in Eastwood High School history and Kyrie Henline reached the school's Top 10 list in the pole vault Tuesday during the Eagles' tri-meet sweep of Northern Buckeye Conference rivals Otsego and Woodmore.

The Eagles won seven of the 17 events and totaled 88 points to beat Woodmore with 72 and Otsego with 15.

Eastwood's boys also swept their meet. The Eagles won 16 events and scored 113½ points to defeat Otsego with 40½ and Woodmore

GIRLS RECAP

The Eagles' seven first-place finishes were complemented by 14 second-place finishes, four third-place finishes and three fourth-place finishes.

The top four finishers in each individual event scored team points on a 5-3-2-1 basis. The relays were scored 5-3.

Downs was second in the 100 with a hand-timed effort of 12.6 that converted to 12.84 FAT by adding the standard conversion of 0.24. The only athletes ahead of Downs on Eastwood's Top 10 are Jamie Schmeltz, who ran 12.71 in 2019; and Christi Lahey, who ran 12.74 in 2004.

Henline cleared 9-0 in the pole vault to move into a four-way tie for ninth place on the school's all-time list. She placed second in the meet, finishing as the runner-up to junior Julia Sabo, who cleared 10-6. Sabo is Eastwood's record holder at 11-6.

Senior Ava Kiefer won twice for Eastwood. She

threw 111-5 to win the discus and 35-10 to win the shot put.

The Eagles' other individual winners were: freshman Leah Emch, 800, 2:39.0; and senior Mikayla Hoelter, long jump, 15-4¼.

Eastwood won two relays.

The 4x200 team of senior Aubrey Haas, sophomore Saylor King, Henline and Downs won in 1:55.5.

The 4x100 team of sophomore Reilly Might, Sabo, King and Downs won in 53.18.

Eleven different individuals won events for the Eagles, who also were first in all four relays.

Eastwood's Cory Jay won twice. The senior won the 1,600 in 4:58.80 and the 3,200 in 10:51.0.

Also winning running events for the Eagles were: junior Noah Smith, 110 hurdles, 16.84; freshman Dayquan Oliver, 400, 55.38; freshman Jesse Poiry, 300 hurdles, 44.48; senior Devin Good, 800, 2:07.0; and sophomore Kaiden Sanchez, 200, 24.34.

Eastwood won all five field events — senior Emmet Getz, discus, 134-7; senior Jacob Meyer, high jump, 5-10; junior Bryce Koprowski-Kistner, long jump, 17-11; senior Nate Heskett, shot, 44-4½; and junior Dalton Hesselbart, pole vault, 13-6.
